As provided by Idaho Code Section 33-203, students who are classified as non-public school students (any student who is legitimately enrolled in a private, parochial, home school, or at a secondary institution, and has not graduated from high school whose credits are to apply toward high school graduation requirements) shall be provided an opportunity to enroll in the Blaine County School District for academic and extracurricular programs subject to the following conditions:

1. The non-public school student must reside with a parent or guardian within the boundaries of the School District, have documentation of date and place of birth, as well as required immunizations. Non-public students may ride a school bus on regularly scheduled routes if space is available and no deviation from the regular route is necessary.
2. The parent/legal guardian of non-public student shall contact the principal of the school they wish their child to attend in order to obtain and complete an application for enrollment.
3. Non-public school students are required to comply with the same rules and regulations, which pertain to the public school student.
4. If a program or class enrollment is at capacity, priority for enrollment shall be given to the student who is enrolled full time in the public school.
5. To be eligible for athletics, the non-public student must meet the following additional criteria:
 - a) Must comply with the same rules and regulations which pertain to any other student who participates in the same activity with the exception of IHSAA Rule 8-1, Academic and Full Time Enrollment.
 - b) Effective January 31, 1996, a student must achieve a minimum composite test score on the Iowa Test of Basic Skills in the fifth stanine or higher. It shall be the responsibility of the student to make arrangements to take the required test and provide the school with the results prior to being granted athletic eligibility.
 - c) A member school student who is academically ineligible and withdraws from school to gain athletic eligibility will be ineligible for the duration of that school year and the following academic year.
 - d) Students who are enrolled in a private IHSAA member school will be ineligible for dual enrollment in athletics at a public school in sports which are offered at the IHSAA member school.

Students who do not meet the eligibility requirement will be excluded from participation in nonacademic activities. No hearing is required and the denial shall be effective immediately.
