Step ONE: Choose a driving program, either public or private. YOU decide what is right for your driver.

Step TWO: Sign up with selected program and pay for class.

Step THREE: Request VOC (Verification of Compliance) from secretary at school office.

Step FOUR: Obtain Driving Permit through DMV (See the following page for detailed instructions)

Getting your Permit/License - DMV

IMPORTANT DOCUMENTS to purchase permit. You <u>must</u> have ALL OF THEM <u>BEFORE</u> YOU GO TO THE DMV

- Parent with an ID or a guardian with court documents
 - Step parents cannot sign for liability. Consulate card will be accepted with proof of residency
- Student's original state-issued birth certificate
 - Not the souvenir with the footprints OR photocopies
- Photo ID of driving student
 - o Idaho ID, school ID card, yearbook photo
- Student's Social Security Number
- VOC--Verification of Compliance
- Location/Name of driver's training
 - Tell the DMV which driving school you signed up with.
- Eye glasses or contacts
 - if needed
- \$26.50 to purchase the permit

• IF YOU DO NOT HAVE ALL OF THE ABOVE LISTED DOCUMENTS THE DMV WILL TURN YOU AWAY!!!

Step FIVE: Communicate with driving school and get registered for the classroom portion. 30 hours of instruction required. Permit # will be needed.

Step SIX: Drive! Once you have completed the requirements and passed, your instructor will give you your permit.

Step SEVEN: 6 month supervised driving period.

During this time you will only be able to drive when accompanied by a licensed adult (21 and over).

You must complete 50 hours of drive time and a 6 month waiting period before taking a written driving test and skills test.

Step EIGHT: Take the written driving test through

the DMV. Note: An adult 21 or over, who can verify the student has driven 50 hours, must be present when the student takes their written test. There will be a \$5 fee for the written test. Written tests are available between 8:00 am and 5:00 pm daily. If you haven't been called to an examiner by 5:00 pm, you will not be allowed to test that day.

Schedule the driving/skills test with an approved examiner. State Approved Examiners

Step NINE: After your skills test, you will need to bring the results your tester gives you to the driver's license office to purchase your license.

*If you are under 16 you will only be allowed to drive in daylight hours.
