# Cell Phone Security

## Add Child Features (Approx \$5 a month)

1. Set usage times (can't text during school or after bedtime)
2. Set allowed phone numbers to communicate with
3. See what applications are being downloaded and used
4. See what numbers are being texted
5. Locate child with GPS on their phone
6. See kids contacts online
7. Receive log files with usage information

Feature is available on all major cell carriers.
