IHSAA Reminders for Winter Sports Season

ACCEPTABLE FAN BEHAVIOR

- -Maintain enthusiasm & composure, serving as a role model.
- -Participate positively in the event or contest by supporting players & coaches.
- -Showing respect & concern for an injured player, no matter the team.
- -Respect the decisions made by game officials.
- -Respect fans, coaches and participants.
- -Encourage surrounding fans to display sportsmanship.



UNACCEPTABLE FAN BEHAVIOR

- -Chants directed at a single opposing player or coach by name or number.
- -Disrespectful or derogatory chants, songs gestures directed at the opposing team.
- -Use of profane, vulgar or abusive language or name calling.
- -Heckling an official's decision, criticizing officials in any way or displays of temper with an official's call.
- -Engaging an opposing fan or group of fans in a dispute or argument.
- -Chants that antagonize opponents or their fans

When the Construction Academy teacher, Ian Blacker, was approached by the Blaine County Housing Association to build bunk beds for temporary housing, he and his students jumped at the chance to help our community. Students in our construction program, using materials that were all donated, are currently working on a prototype and enjoying the design process in tweaking plans found online and material estimating. One tweak is to include a ladder into the frame, forcing

students to consider all the requirements for ladders, child safety, practicality, and budgets. Once the prototype is completed and approved, students plan to build 10-12 bunk beds for BCHA.


